The Health & Safety Officer will be responsible for overseeing and maintaining health and safety policies, ensuring compliance with statutory regulations, and providing strategic support on related issues. This role is pivotal in ensuring the safety of operations, activities, and events. They will work closely with the Steward (Domestic Bursar) at Christ Church and Estates Manager at Pembroke to manage the health and safety and compliance functions and will be involved in strategic discussions to guide the approach to health and safety.

The successful candidate will hold two part-time contracts with both organisations, making a combined full-time role, and will provide dedicated support to both, splitting their time equally across the two.

Key Responsibilities

Strategic Oversight

- Contribute to strategic discussions and decision-making processes, particularly those related to health and safety and compliance.
- Provide expert advice on health, safety, and compliance issues during major events, projects, and initiatives.
- Convene and document minutes for the Health & Safety Committees, ensuring that all decisions and actions are recorded and followed up.





Health & Safety and Compliance Management

- Develop and maintain up-to-date Health & Safety (H&S) policies and procedures, ensuring they align with current legislation and best practices.
- Ensure compliance with Universities UK (UUK) requirements for accommodation, including regular audits and checks.
- Maintain accurate documentation of all compliance checks, ensuring a clear audit trail.
- Manage accident and incident records, ensuring that all lessons learned are captured and communicated to help prevent future occurrences.
- Monitor statutory compliance in critical areas such as water, electricity, gas, asbestos management, and Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (COSHH).
- Develop and maintain fire evacuation procedures, ensuring they align with current legislation and best practices.
- Coordinate and execute regular fire drills, to ensuring that the fire evacuation procedures are robust and effective.
- Conduct risk assessments and provide support for major college events to ensure the safety of all participants.
- Coordinate health and safety briefings and training.
- Ensure that all H&S equipment, such as defibrillators, is available, well-maintained, and regularly serviced.

Sports and Grounds

- Provide specific health and safety briefings and training to sports teams and staff, ensuring all activities comply with H&S guidelines.
- Ensure that all H&S equipment at the Sports Pavilions and Boat Houses are well-maintained and regularly serviced.

Support to Steward (Domestic Bursar)/Estates Manager

Assist the Steward (Domestic Bursar)/Estates Manager with:

- Oversight of Health & Safety and compliance functions.
- Managing the Health & Safety and compliance budget, ensuring efficient use of resources.
- Scheduling and coordinating compliance testing, liaising with specialists and external contractors as required, and ensuring follow-up work is completed.
- Ensuring that annual audits, including H&S, access, and fire-risk audits, are scheduled and findings communicated and overseeing the implementation of audit recommendations.
- Preparing and presenting papers on health and safety and compliance issues to the Health & Safety Committee and other relevant bodies.





• Overseeing the preparation of risk assessments and Personal Emergency Evacuation Plans (PEEPs) for events, college operations, and access requirements.
